Happy July! This month we have a photoshoot, news about our new name, a photography presentation at the library, and more!

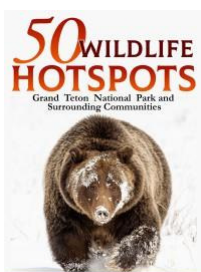

Of interest to our group members is a program featuring photographer Jim Herrington **on Thursday, July 19 at 6:30pm in the Ordway Auditorium at the Teton County Library**. The FREE program will feature Herrington, who will be speaking about and show slides from his newly published book "The Climbers," a book of portraits of legendary rock climbers that took a couple decades to make.

Jim began this series shooting with black-and-white analog film, yet during the course of the project, with the advent of digital photography, it looked as if film would disappear completely—like hemp rope or hobnail boots. Indeed, at times it was difficult to know which would vanish first, the climbers he was photographing or the film he was using. Luckily, film got an eleventh hour reprieve and he was pleased to be able to shoot the entirety of this book on silver halide film, which remains his chosen method of taking pictures to this day.
