It's a one-stop, comprehensive walkthrough for making both single- and multi-row Milky Way panoramic images of the Milky Way.

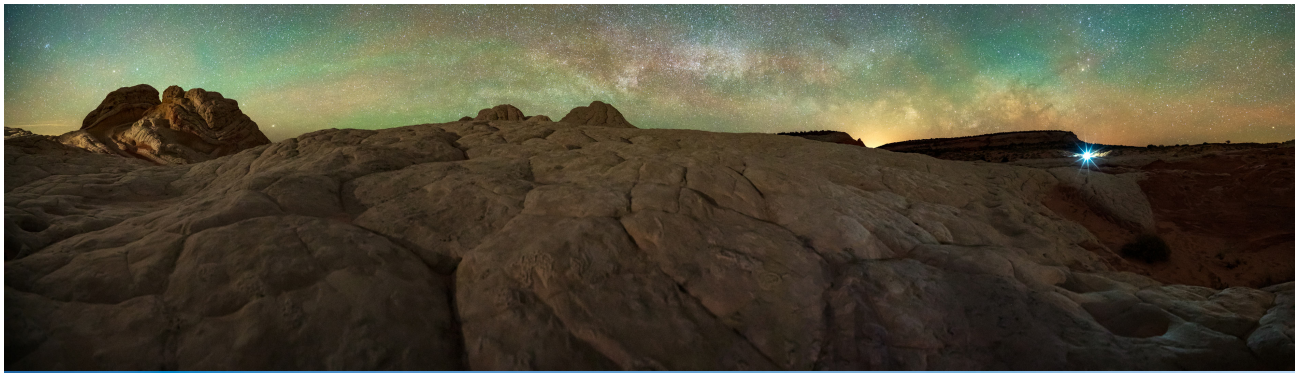
