- **Sunday, June 7:** Entry deadline June contest. While the entry submission time is short it is well worth your time to enter.
- **Wednesday, June 17, 6pm:** During the monthly video meeting on Wednesday, June 17 the top 10 images will be selected by popular vote of the members. A panel of 4 professional photographers will select the final 5 images. Judges and members will be able to view all submitted images prior to the June 17th meeting, a link to a web page with images will be distributed 4 days before the meeting.

The link for the meeting with the password will also be emailed a few days before the meeting.

- **Wednesday, June 24, 7pm:** Virtual Peer Mentor Meeting. This month's theme is Natural Frames. Both peer mentor groups will meet via the video meeting software, Zoom. Instructions will be mailed to members of these groups. Each Peer Mentor Group has their own theme for the month, but because both groups will be gathering together on-line using

Zoom this month everyone will send Randy photos of the same theme: "Natural Frames."
