We will accept up to 100 images in total. Each TPC member can submit up to three (3) images. Entry deadline is **TUESDAY, SEPT. 8**. While the entry submission time is short it is well worth your time to enter. Prizes will be awarded as follows for each level:

1st Place - \$250 B & H gift card
2nd Place - \$125 B & H gift card
3rd Place - \$75 B & H gift card
Honorable Mention - \$25 B & H gift card
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Please make sure you thoroughly read, understand, and adhere to the rules and instructions.
